THE ELIZABETH GARDNER VOICE AWARD 2023

Elizabeth Gardner was a singer whose musical interests included longtime membership in The Birmingham Musicale. She served as President of that Senior Club from 1941 till 1943. This award, in her memory, was established by her daughters as a Michigan Federation of Music Clubs award. It was supported - until her death - by her daughter, Margaret Snyder, also a Past President of The Birmingham Musicale, a longtime member of the Board of Directors of Michigan Federation of Music Clubs, and a Life Member of National Federation of Music Clubs.

Auditions for the 2023 award were held on April 29, 2023, in University Presbyterian Church, Rochester Hills, Michigan. Publicity and informational flyers were posted on the MFMC website and sent to over thirty voice faculty at various colleges and universities, as well as private voice teachers, and students who had participated in previous years. There were five requests for application forms and five completed applications were actually received. The adjudicators were Anne Nispel and Harlan Jennings, both faculty members at Michigan State University.

The Second Place Award of \$350 was won by Tenor, Cole Harvey, who is 22 years old, and is from Highland, Michigan. Cole is pursuing a Master of Music Degree, majoring in Voice Performance, at Michigan State University, where he studies with Richard Fracker.

The winner of the First Place Award of \$1,000 was Tenor, Kellan Dunlap. Kellan is 22 years old, and has just recently graduated from Oakland University, where he earned a Bachelor of Music degree, majoring in Voice Performance, while studying with Drake Dantzler.

Already, Kellan has had much success with his singing. In 2021 and in 2022, he was awarded First Prize in the Great Lakes Region competition of National Association of Teachers of Singing National Student Auditions. In both years, he advanced to the National Semi-final round. In 2022, he continued to the National Final round, ultimately winning First Prize in the NATS National Student Auditions Upper-Classical Division.

In addition, Kellan has had much experience in operatic roles, including the title role of <u>Acis</u> in *Acis and Galatea*, <u>Duke of Dunstable</u> in *Patience*, and <u>First Officer</u> in *Dialogues des Carmelites*. His roles in scene work include: <u>Tamino</u> in *Der Zauberflote*, <u>Don Ottavio</u> in *Don Giovanni* and <u>Martin</u> in *The Tender Land*. Most recently, he has performed the lead role of <u>Ferrando</u> in *Cosi fan tutte*, to much acclaim. In June, Kellan will begin serving as an Apprentice Artist at OPERA San Antonio, performing the roles of <u>Frederick</u> in *Pirates of Penzance* and <u>The Gingerbread Witch</u> in *Hansel und Gretel*.

Offstage, Kellan is a dedicated voice teacher who maintains studios in Troy, White Lake and Grand Rapids, and in 2021, he was selected to receive the Myrtle Mehan/Hazel Morgan Music Education Award by the National Federation of Music Clubs. In his free time, Kellan loves learning languages and reading poetry. Also, he enjoys spending time with his family and his dogs, Bella and Ruby.

Having been accepted at many prestigious collegiate music institutions in order to continue his music education, Kellan has decided to attend the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University in Houston, Texas, - beginning in Fall, 2023 - where he will pursue a Master of Music degree, majoring in Voice Performance.

2023 ROSAMOND P. HAEBERLE MEMORIAL PIANO AWARD \$5,000

Rosamond P. Haeberle was President of Michigan Federation of Music Clubs from 1993-1995. She died in 2005 and bequeathed this endowment award to the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs, for a student pursuing a degree in music, whose major instrument is piano. This annual award serves as a testament to her enduring love of music and to her lifelong desire to encourage and assist young musicians, everywhere.

The auditions for the fourteenth annual MFMC Rosamond P. Haeberle Memorial Piano Award were held on April 22, 2023, at University Presbyterian Church, Rochester Hills, Michigan. The adjudicators were Canadian pianist Dr. Philip Adamson, (University of Windsor, Canada), and internationally renowned pianists Dr. Kazimierz Brzozowski and Dr. Robert Conway, both affiliated with Wayne State University, Detroit, Michigan.

Six applications were received. Following guidelines established by MFMC in line with Rosamond Haeberle's bequest, after review of the applications by the Application Evaluation Committee, all six applicants were selected to audition. Each applicant performed for a maximum of thirty minutes.

The winner is Nhi Luong, who is 26 years old, and is originally from Vietnam. Nhi was born and raised in a musical family, and started playing piano when she was four years old. At the age of nine, she entered the Vietnam National Academy of Music, from which she graduated in 2014, at the age of eighteen, with a Diploma in Piano Performance. In 2014, after a series of auditions held by the ASIA-Uninet in Southeast Asia, she was the only candidate selected to receive a full scholarship to study for one year at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Graz, Austria. During her time in Austria, she was engaged in many performances in Europe, including Bad Goisern in Austria, Karlsruhe, in Germany, and Aarhus, in Denmark. Upon her return from Austria, Nih attended the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music in Singapore, where she earned a Bachelor of Music degree, with a major in Piano Performance. In 2019, she entered the University of Michigan, where she earned a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance and Chamber Music.

Nhi has already had much success in Music Festivals and Competitions. In 2017, she won the Yong Siew Toh Concerto Competition, and in 2023, she won the MTNA National Competition. Most recently, she won the University of Michigan School of Music Concerto Competition, which gained her a concert engagement with the University Symphony Orchestra in Fall, 2023.

In addition, Nhi has been selected to perform in various international festivals, including the Amalfi Music Festival in Italy, the Ehgadin Summer Piano Academy in Samedan, Switzerland, and Musical Chairs in Montreal, Canada. Also, she has worked alongside many world-famous musicians, including Andras Schiff, Gabor Takacs-Nagy, Stephen Hough, Shlomo Mintz, Nelson Goerner and David Fray.

Currently, Nhi is attending the University of Michigan School of Music, where she is pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance, while studying with Dr. Christopher Harding.

MFMC 2023 JUNIOR COMPOSERS CONTEST

There were 15 student compositions submitted, ranging in age from 6 to 17. Out of the 15 composition entries, 15 students received SUPERIOR RATING. I did send out a mass email letter with attachments to last year's teachers and other teachers who inquired about Junior Composers. The deadline for the composition contest was January 15, 2023.

The adjudicator was Dr. Scott Robert Harding. He holds a BM in Theory/Composition from Central Michigan School of Music. His MM & Ph.D is in composition from Michigan State University. He is a member of the CMU School of music since 1998 where he teaches theory and composition. He is an active composer and performer, his art music focuses on small chamber ensembles that showcase intricate playfulness and knotted interwoven lines. He is co-director of the Great Lakes Art Music Ensemble. He is co-lyricist for the rock band IRON FIST and they have released & recorded nearly 50 songs since 2015.

There were 8 Michigan winners chosen. The 8 Michigan winners are being judged at the NE Regional level. The 8 winners from Michigan are:

A Junior Composer Recital will take place on Saturday, April 22, 2023, at Kawai Piano Gallery in Bloomfield Township. All students, teachers, parents, friends, and relatives will be invited to attend the recital. Junior Composers personally thanks our past state president Mrs. Beatrice Wassenberg for arranging the recital venue. Following the recital, we will present awards including cash prizes to 1st and 2nd place winners, gold cups, certificates, etc. Junior Composers follows a patriotic theme. The student entry fee was \$30. There were 8 teachers who participated in the Jr. Composer contest.

Aaron Wang - High School Piano Award - First Prize Winner

Aaron Wang, pianist, 16 years old, studies with Catherine Rollin. In 2023, he won the Thelma Byrum Piano Award and the Steinway Young Artists Piano Competition. He also placed 2nd nationally in the Stillman Kelley and Marilyn Caldwell competitions. Aaron has won all three divisions of MMTA state finals. In 2021, he was an MTNA national finalist and won first prizes in both the solo and concerto MMTA competitions. Additionally, he was a finalist in the International Kaufman Piano Competition in 2017. As a composer, Aaron was a three-time national finalist in the MTNA composition competition, placing 2nd nationally in 2018. Aaron also received the prestigious Slotkin Music Scholarship for Cranbrook Schools in 2021 and is the founder of the Slotkin Trio.

Ryan Li - High School Piano Award – Second Prize Winner

Ryan Li is 15 years old, and he is currently a 10th grader at Cranbrook Kingswood Upper School. He began playing piano at the age of six with Dr. Nai-wen Wang. He has gotten First Place in Division II for the Steinway Junior Piano Competition 2019, and First Place (tie) in Junior Division for MMTA State Piano Final 2019. He began to study playing piano with Professor Christopher Harding since 2019. In 2021, He won a First Place in the Schoolcraft Piano Honors Recital for the Junior Division. He has also been a Slotkin scholar for Cranbrook since his sophomore year. He also received a 2nd place award in the 2023 Steinway Young Artist Competition. Ryan also enjoys playing the cello and golfing.

Joslyn Phillips - High School Voice Award

Joslyn Phillips is a 10th grade student at Bloomfield Hills High School. She has been active in various choirs, vocal competitions, and theatre productions in the Metro Detroit community including the Michigan Opera Theatre Children's Chorus and Kirk in the Hills Youth Choir. Joslyn plans to pursue a vocal music degree.

Nikolas is also an avid sports enthusiast, playing travel soccer and currently holding the position of captain of his school's varsity soccer team.

The recipient of this year's Burrell-Upton Music Therapy Award is Ashley Sherwood. Her situation is unique in that she is finally achieving her goal after being married for 16 years and raising 3 young daughters. After supporting her husband as he finished his education, Ashley enrolled at Grand Valley State University to complete her Bachelor of Arts in Music in 2018. While there, she focused on choosing courses to prepare her for the Music Therapy Equivalency and Graduate program at Western Michigan University with a minor in Psychology.

Ashley has thrived in the Music Therapy Program at WMU, earning a 3.99 GPA and being placed on the Dean's list every semester. Additionally, she was awarded the Michigan Music Therapists Memorial Scholarship last fall. A professional educator for over 40 years with over 45 years of nonprofit experience, Laurie's shining merit for this highest honor from the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs is made clear by the many years of her service in local, state, and national level committees and activities of the National Federation of Music Clubs, as well as her imaginative and ethical conscientiousness in administration.

Michigan has seen a huge amount of success and advancement for our pre-college and collegiate students for more than a decade, a direct result of Laurie's work, expertise, and passion for our young pianists' opportunities. I have also witnessed first-hand, and on multiple occasions, the excellence of her own studio and dedicated pedagogy.

There is no one more worthy of this award than Laurie. An active musician since six years old, continuing through service in her church for five decades, a serious student of both the piano and voice in college and graduate school at Indiana University, a performer on stage (her career bookends begin with Christina in the *Marriage of Figaro* and finish in 2014 with the Countess from the same), a teacher of prize-winning pre-college pianists; these personal achievements form the basis of her excellence as an inspiring professional to all of us in Michigan. But in my personal experience, her work as a coordinator and administrator in service to our students is the most admirable, the most impactful contribution to all of us, a legacy that will continue to impact us for potentially decades to come.

Laurie has been a teacher advisor to the Lake Michigan Student and Junior Club since 2012, and president of the Lake Michigan Music Club (senior club) since 2018. During this time, she has initiated masterclass, recital and symposia opportunities for the club and the community, expanding the education of her students and their families through sessions dedicated to musical history, practice as a performer and presenter in public, and interaction with collegiate professors of national and international importance, from first-rank collegiate music programs.

Her service to MFMC is even more impressive and extensive: President 2017-2019; service as First and Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary (two terms), Parliamentarian, Chair for the Bylaws, Finance, High School Piano Award, Leadership Education, and Technology Committees; Southwest District Treasurer 2013-2017, and service on *five* state convention committees. The extraordinary thing is that all this service has been instigated and propelled by her desire to best serve our students in their performing and competition experiences, to make an impact on how we run and adjudicate, and above all, on how we encourage and educate our students, *for the students*. I admire this more than I can say.

Beyond her state service, Laurie's commitment to student opportunities really shines at the national level: she serves as the NFMC National Junior Division Chair, on the Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee, the Policy Resolution Committee, Vivace Festival Committee; she was the Stillman Kelley Award Chair from 2018 to 2021 and serves as the St. Joseph Festival Area Administrator. These important NFMC roles are making significant contributions to the level of accomplishment for students nationwide and bring honor to Michigan as an ever-increasingly important state in the Federation.

We all know that this is but half of Laurie's service activity. There is not room here to further detail her work for all our students and teachers in the Michigan Music Teachers Association, or her work for the Chicago Area Music Teachers Association, her philanthropy through the Gilmore Festival in Kalamazoo or her own concert series in Saint Joseph, or her non-profit work for the Heritage Museum and Cultural Center, or as an active member of the Board of the Michigan State Association of Parliamentarians.

I started this letter by writing in admiration; I have come to the end and realized that I am also exceedingly proud to nominate her for the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs Citation Award. Out of professional necessity I keep an eye on the precollege and collegiate pianistic activity of the nation and am well aware of the centers for pianistic excellence and achievement from year to year. Michigan is coming to the fore through Laurie's efforts, and I could not be more grateful.

The **Lake Michigan Music Club** (LMMC) is an affiliate of the National Federation of Music Clubs and the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs.

LMMC was established in September 2018 following a Michigan Federation of Music Clubs, Board of Directors' meeting, where the Board determined a need to establish a virtual senior club to accommodate non-teaching and non-performing state leadership members. Immediately, LMMC grew to respond to and include competition university faculty and private studio instructors with membership status to serve and/or participate in NFMC and MFMC leadership positions, award competitions, and Festival.

LMMC provides membership. Members pay club dues, which covers both national and state membership dues and magazines. There are no meetings, performance, resident status, nor citizenship requirements. However, each member must hold a degree, certificate, or have extensive experience in their leadership, service, or teaching area or near completion of such with membership recommendation. It is a professional membership club.

LMMC recognizes the NFMC and MFMC Bylaws, Standing Rules, Administrative Manual, and Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised as its operating authority.

As of March 2023, LMMC membership includes twenty-six Federated members - all active including those serving in NFMC and MFMC leadership positions, competition university faculty, independent studio teachers, and those retired from active music-related careers and/or sponsorships.

The **St. Joseph Festival Area** was established and sanctioned by the NFMC and MFMC leadership to fill a void in local Festival availability to NFMC and MFMC Junior Members in Southwest Michigan, throughout the state, region, and beyond.

As of March 2023, students from four states and throughout Michigan participated in a multiple day Festival event. All NFMC teacher members with Junior Club registered members may participate in NFMC Festivals in accordance with NFMC Festival Bulletin Rules.

The St. Joseph Festival Area was the first Festival Area in Michigan to be onboarded to the NFMC Vivace Festival Online Management System as a statewide test. Immediately, larger Michigan Festival Areas, i.e., Grand Rapid and Livonia-Madonna, onboarded where now Michigan is one of the leading states utilizing Vivace Festival management.

The St. Joseph Festival Area is the only NFMC Festival Area which includes LIVE, LIVE ONLINE, and RECORDED Festival participation, making it the leader in future Festival standards. Initially, the move to offer more performance options was established for health and safety concerns due to the pandemic. However, the Festival Committee determined the performance options allowed for more diversity and inclusion, especially those limited by faith-based scheduling restrictions.

Lake Michigan Student and Junior Music Club (LMSJMC) was established by the members of The Children's Academy, St. Joseph, Michigan, as they prepared for NFMC and MFMC Awards and NFMC Festivals. The club offers an Artist-Educator Series including professional musician lecture recitals, master classes, summer seminars, and performance opportunities. All Federated teachers, students, and juniors are eligible for event participation; however, they are not eligible for membership due to the Individual Studio Membership status. LMSJMC is not a division of the LMMC.

For its 115th year, Monday Musical Club, Inc. has experienced growth and positivity in all aspects of our Club resulting in increased membership of both our senior and club-sponsored Junior Club memberships. Below is a summary of our main initiatives, **in bold**, reflecting the renewed focus of our Board and the efforts of our members to increase connections within and outside of Monday Musical Club (MMC).

Our **Community Concert Series*** has had increases in both membership and community attendance over the last year at every evening event. Our seven concerts feature regional and local talent, and also include performances by our **Women's Chorus** at our 91st Annual Vesper Service in December 2022 and our upcoming June 5, 2023, concert. Our **Women's Chorus** is one of our main draws for new senior membership.

Another source of new membership is our **Club-Sponsored Junior Club***. The seven meetings included junior member individual performances followed by guest artist/educator sessions in a variety of areas. Attendance by students, family, MMC members and the public has almost doubled over last year.

Our **Junior Club Scholarship*** competition in January 2023 resulted in four <u>full</u> awards: two piano students to Interlochen, a violinist to U of Michigan seminar and a pianist to Blue Lake. Award recipients perform at our May *Community Concert** and recap their summer experiences at our October *Community Concert**.

A result from MMC's strategic planning process was a pilot *Community Outreach* **Grants Program** to assist area arts programs. One grant subsidized our local St. Joseph High School Orchestra/Band to rent large instruments during their trip to Spain. A requirement of the Grant was to participate at a MMC event. The high school's Orchestra Ensembles performed at our November 7, 2022 *Community Concert**. MMC also awarded funds to Lake Michigan Community College to support their high school/college age community Summer Student Art series. Our members attended the student-only musical and individual/group performances at their end of season recital. The coordinator of this college program will be the guest artist/educator at a future **Junior Club** meeting. The **Grants Program** is now a permanent aspect of MMC with applications posted on our website.

To increase member and public connections we created an **MMC logo** and added Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn to our existing Facebook accounts, posting events and interactive questions. On the technology side, we invested in a new website platform/address to **MondayMusicalClubMI.org** to increase searchability. MMC is a member of TechSoup, a nonprofit network that provides technical software to other nonprofits. Through TechSoup we purchase online QuickBooks and a 100 person Zoom account at a substantial discount.

MMC started using **Board generic Google accounts** by position. i.e. Pres.MondayMusical@gmail.com last fall. These free Google accounts provide Gmail and Google drive to place any MMC files within that position, removing files and emails from private computers with unknown cyber safeguards.

Additionally, MMC introduced a **Conflict-of-Interest policy** to prevent any personal or business membership conflicts from developing and putting our non-profit status at risk.

It is an honor to report on the dedicated efforts of our members to continue musical experiences in our area.
